

THE TENTH AMENDMENT: WHAT DOES IT MEAN?

The actual wording of the Tenth Amendment:

The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people.

A hypothetical wording of the Tenth Amendment:

The powers not expressly delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people.

Question: How would the meaning of the Tenth Amendment change if it used the hypothetical wording? What does this tell us about what the actual Tenth Amendment really means?
