CONGRESSIONAL LEADERSHIP CHART

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Speaker of the House

*Elected by all representatives; therefore normally a member of the majority party and de facto leader of the majority party
*Typically is the most powerful officer in the House, but his/her power may be less if his/her party's majority is slim or if there is lack of cohesion within his/her party

Majority Leader

•Elected by majority party

Majority Whip

•Elected by majority party

Minority Leader

•Elected by minority party

Minority Whip

•Elected by minority party

SENATE

Vice President of the United States

Not necessarily a member of the Senate's majority party
Can only vote to break a tie
Usually doesn't preside on day-to-day basis

President Pro Tempore of the Senate

Elected by all senators; is normally the longest-serving member of the majority party

•May preside in the absence of the Vice President of the US but usually delegates the presiding role to a more junior senator

Majority Leader
